HAPPY GROUNDHOG DAY



Groundhog Day is celebrated with a groundhog prediction, festivities, food and speeches. According to Groundhog Day folklore, And if the groundhog happens to emerge from his burrow and sees his shadow winter will last another six weeks.

The holiday was established by Congress in 1885 and started as a celebration of Washington's birthday in Washington, D.C., but was later expanded to the rest of the country.
